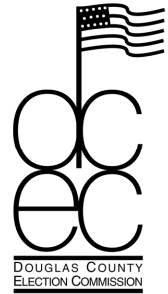

Early Voting Ballot by Mail

Registered voters may vote an early voting ballot instead of voting at their polling place. Early voting ballots must be requested in writing by 4:00 p.m. on Wednesday, May 5, 2010. Early voting ballots CANNOT be requested by telephone or email. Requests must be mailed, faxed, or delivered to the Douglas County Election Commission. Early voting ballots will be mailed to voters beginning Monday, April 5, 2010. Early voting ballots must be returned to the Election Commission by 8:00 p.m. on Tuesday, May 11, 2010.

Early Voting Ballot by Agent

A registered voter may appoint an agent to pick up an early voting ballot at the Election Commission beginning Monday, April 5, 2010. The deadline to request an early voting ballot by agent is 7:00 p.m. on Tuesday, May 11, 2010. Early voting ballots must be returned to the Election Commission by 8:00 p.m. on Tuesday, May 11, 2010. No person shall act as an agent for more than two registered voters in any election.

Early Voting in Person

A registered voter may vote early at the Election Commission prior to Election Day during regular business hours, 8:30 a.m. to 5:00 p.m., Monday through Friday, excluding holidays. Early voting in person for this election will begin Monday, April 5, 2010 and end Monday, May 10, 2010.

Warning: Voting and returning an early voting ballot eliminates your right to vote at your polling place. The penalty for election falsification is imprisonment for up to five years, a fine not to exceed \$10,000, or both.
